The final report is shared on propane.com/salesreport and incorporated into the National and State Propane Profiles, showing market trends by state and region.

NPGA panel: Prepare now for natural disasters

An emergency preparedness panel discussion at the NPGA winter meetings in New Orleans focused on how to protect propane industry businesses against natural disasters and other emergencies.

Daniel Dixon of Energy Distribution Partners moderated a detailed discussion involving panelists Christina Armentano of New York-based Paraco Gas, Dale Calhoun of the Florida Propane Gas Association, Randy Hayden of the Louisiana Propane Gas Association, Stan Hays of Operation BBQ Relief and Eric Kuster of PERC.

Here are some of the best practices discussed by the panel:

Develop a strong network before you need it.

This includes state associations, local government officials and other propane retailers.

Build relationships in your community and know the emergency managers, Hays says.

"You need to know who they are, and this doesn't happen overnight," he says. "These relationships make a difference. Many times, it's the sheriff or fire chief in smaller counties."

Developing relationships with regulators and lawmakers, and communicating with them in times of need, is also an important part of persevering through an emergency, Hayden and Calhoun say. And don't be afraid to reach out to a competitor to ensure customers' propane needs are met during an emergency.

"We can do so much more together than divided," Hays says.

Have a written business continuity plan in place.

Kuster says such a plan will help marketers maintain their ability to run the business amid any impactful event.

A business continuity plan might include a checklist of resources that offer support during an emergency: local emergency planning committees, state offices of emergency planning, the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security. PERC provides emergency planning materials at propane.com, and the panel also suggests industry members contact their insurance companies for assistance.

"It all comes down to a plan," says Armentano, recalling Paraco Gas' experience with Hurricane Sandy in 2012 and lessons learned in the areas of backup power generation and phone system operation. "Think about every scenario and what you need to do. We need to learn from these crises."

Prepare early.

Hurricanes offer a window of preparation time, and Calhoun says it's imperative for the industry to communicate as early as possible – with association members, lawmakers and employees.

"If you depend on the grid like everybody else, have a generator ready to load your trucks," says Calhoun, later adding, "Work off the top of that tank; don't work off the bottom."

While companies must be cautious not to scare customers, Armentano says, education is critical. She suggests using call services to disseminate key information to a customer base.

Hurricane-prone Louisiana is among the leading states for propane and gas generator installations, Hayden says. However, in times of high demand, marketers struggle to meet the needs of customers who have only a small tank and generator that's used sparingly.

Hayden suggests that marketers consider foregoing "the quick sale" rather than trying to meet the long-term needs of small generator customers.

Propane industry members in the audience contributed their best practices as well. Jeff Stewart of Blue Star Gas says two-way radios have allowed better communication between teams rather than the silo approach of cellphones.

And while many of the emergencies discussed related to weather events and natural disasters, Tom Manson of Eastern Propane & Oil reminded industry members to plan also for a cyberattack.

Propane-Powered Generators: Today's Technology to Power the Future

Every year, billions of dollars are lost to weather-related electric grid outages, driving record sales of remote power generation units nationwide.

It's no surprise. Power outages are increasingly common as the aging grid strains under increased demand and the impact of severe weather events like hurricanes, wildfires and flooding.

Increasingly, Americans are spending upwards of \$20,000 to buy a home back up system to keep heating and cooling, lighting, refrigeration, internet, and other critical building amenities running.

According to Jim Bunsey, PERC's director of commercial development, the trend has created a rare opportunity for all types of propane power generation units to deliver reliable, clean energy to homes and businesses across the country.

Propane offers affordable solutions to make homes and buildings more resilient. Whether for primary or backup power, propane generators are quieter, more efficient, and far more environmentally friendly than diesel options. Yet 90 percent of current U.S. backup generators run on diesel.

"The fact is, propane power generation is today's technology to power the future," says Bunsey. "We have the optimum solution for backup power, combined heat and power (CHP) and microgrids to provide resilience wherever there is no reliability."

CHP systems differ from backup generators in that they recover waste heat from the production of electricity and put it to use for a building's hot water and space heating. CHP can be used either as robust backup power or a facility's primary power source.

Propane has always been an ideal standby power fuel because it doesn't degrade over time, unlike diesel or gasoline.

It also offers the advantage of powering other major appliances besides the generator to minimize disruptions when entire communities go dark indefinitely.

But most compelling, the surge in the use of dirty diesel

generators exacerbates local air quality concerns at the same time consumers are aggressively responding to climate change concerns. Because propane is the cleanest alternative energy for back-up power, it can displace diesel generators and significantly improve local air quality - particularly by mitigating nitrogen oxides and particulate matter.

Bunsey notes that propane already is playing a key role in the utility and power generation industry in remote, wildfire-prone locations in California:

- •BoxPower and Generac are providing solar photovoltaic (PV) with battery backup and propane generator solutions.
- •Pacific Gas & Electric's 2021 wildfire mitigation plan reports that the solar PV and battery combination with supplemental propane gensets is the most cost effective, most reliable, and cleanest solution for grid sites.
- •Electric utilities are deenergizing the transmission and distribution lines and installing microgrid solutions to avert forest fires.

Bunsey also sees great potential for propane to capitalize on CHP and microgrid technologies across the nation, noting high growth projections for applications to alleviate grid outages and power remote data centers and edge computing data centers.

"All commercial and residential buildings need reliable, clean, and affordable power. That's why propane marketers need to talk to power generation equipment providers to understand this critically important opportunity."

Infrastructure Grant Program Opens

The Federal Highway Administration has announced the availability of \$700 million through the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program to strategically deploy alternative fueling infrastructure projects (including propane) in urban and rural communities in publicly accessible locations, including downtown areas and local neighborhoods, particularly in underserved and disadvantaged communities. In addition, a portion of the funding will be reserved to deploy infrastructure along federally-designated refueling corridors. Applications must be submitted electronically through Grants.gov no later than 11:59 p.m., Eastern Time, on Tuesday, May 30, 2023. Eligible applicants include states, local governments, special purpose districts or public authorities with a transportation function, including port authorities, Indian tribes, and U.S. Territories.

NPGA has compiled a list of every federally-designated Autogas refueling corridor in each state, an FAQ on the program, and letter to send to local and state government entities on NPGA's member dashboard under the Fight Electrification tab. ELDT and ACE

Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) is a federally regulated training requirement set by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) as of February 7, 2022. It affects any individual looking to obtain a

new Commercial Drivers' License (CDL) and/or the HAZMAT endorsement. The ELDT requires behind-thewheel and classroom training. This must be provided by a Registered Training Provider (RTP) before an individual can apply for a CDL/HAZMAT endorsement.

The NPGA Administrative Compliance Experts (ACE) services assists individuals in completing the regulatory requirements set by FMCSA. Through ACE and with NPGA serving as your Registered Training Provider (RTP), the 30+ steps mandated by ELDT can become 5 simple steps. As the RTP, NPGA will handle: all paperwork reviews and filings, submissions to FMCSA, and management of compliance records for any potential audits.


